Llantwit Major Town Council Ongoing Projects

Town Hall Lift

A Planning Application was approved on 2023/00436/FUL to install a new internal lift in the Town Hall following consultations with the Architect, Heritage and Conservation Officers.

The lift installation would make the Town Hall an inclusive building for everyone to use and hire.

The next phase of the Project is to obtain Quotations for the purchase, installation of a lift and renovation work to the Town Hall Building to incorporate the new lift.

Once Quotations have been sought the Town Council can look at applying for Grants to assist with funding this Project.

This Project would provide the means for the Town Council to continue to maintain this historic building for future generations.

Stradling Park Community Garden

Last year the Town Council successfully secured a Grant from the Lottery Fund to develop a Community Garden with the help of local volunteers in Stradling Park. The Plot has been levelled, fencing erected around the Garden and accessible pathway laid that is suitable for wheelchairs /mobility scooters using the site.

Plans our now underway to hold regular Open Days, encouraging residents to come along to help with the next phase of the project.

Plans include:

- Installing a Metal Shed on the site
- Erecting a poly tunnel
- Building and planting raised beds
- Creating a sensory Garden
- Creating a wet/wildlife area
- Undertaking workshop for the community (both young and old) encouraging groups to use the Garden for education and improve their wellbeing

West Street Pond/ Mid Well

Last year a grant and permission were obtained to clear the overgrown area of vegetation up to Midwell, this has now been completed.

The next stages of the project are:

- 1. Removal of trees next to Midwell due to ash dieback
- 2. Rebuild of Midwell, wall and associated ironworks
- 3. Installation of boardwalk
- 4. Reintroduction of wildlife and natural species

These stages are all subject to obtaining grant funding and would be in the region of £40,000, although costings for points 1 and 2 still being sought.

A lectern is going to be installed on site in the near future which will give details on the history of Midwell and inform residents of our plans for the area, including a QR code so they can log on and register their interest in the project and to gain their views on whether they are for or against project, plus any ideas going forward that will assist with grant application.

Allotments

The Town Council have over 111 Allotment Plots on the Llanmaes Road Allotment Site. Plots vary in price from £10 to £60 a year. At present there is a waiting list for people wanting to own a plot and grow their own fruit and vegetables. 

Public Toilets and Town Hall Car Parks

Following lengthy negotiations with the Vale of Glamorgan Council the Town Council have agreed in principle to take over the responsibility for the public toilets and 3 car parks within the Town. Some of the discussions that centred around taking over the ownership were the existing problems with the:

- Drainage issues at the bottom end of Boverton Road car park
- Condition of the surface of the Town Hall car park
- Lack of lighting within Town Hall car park
- Fenced area within Old School car park overgrown vegetation and damaged wall

Works have been undertaken by the VOGC to clear the vegetation behind the fenced area within Old School. The Town Council have ensured that the Vale of Glamorgan Council will resurface and line the Town Hall car park as part of the takeover agreement.

We have also negotiated for the Vale Council to install street lighting in the Town Hall Car Park to increase the safety for the residents and visitors to our town.

Hire the Town Council Buildings for your Wedding

For the last few years couples can get married at reasonable costs in the heart of Llantwit Major town. There are also opportunities now to get married in the outside area in front of the Council Chamber, Old School. The Town Council now have a canvas and inflatable marquee available for hire at rates of £50.00 per day.



Hire of Old School (south annexe and Council Chamber) and Town Hall for Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Deposit required of £50 minimum and £120 bond in case of damages.

Resident Llantwit Major

Hire of Council Chamber for wedding only - £300

Hire of Town Hall for wedding reception only - £450

Outside Llantwit Major

Hire of Council Chamber for wedding only - £400

Hire of Town Hall for wedding reception only - £600

* Resident is defined as someone on the electoral role of Llantwit Major and contributing towards Council Tax. This must be one of the persons getting married.
